Pre-approval is required for well decommissioning activities and special water development projects.

Applicants are encouraged to assess their project against the program criteria and determine program eligibility.

# Funding

Well Decommissioning projects are eligible for a rebate of 90 per cent of eligible costs to a maximum payment of \$10,000 per project.

Special projects are eligible for a maximum rebate of 50 per cent of pre-approved eligible costs to a maximum payment of \$150,000.

# Eligibility

Eligible applicants:

- Agricultural Producers
- Agri-Businesses (including Value-Added Processing)
- First Nations
- Saskatchewan Rural Municipalities

All applicants must demonstrate an agricultural use for the water (crop spraying, livestock watering or greenhouse production) in addition to meeting the following criteria:

 Producers who own, lease or rent property where livestock and poultry are grown, bred, kept, raised, displayed, assembled or disposed of require a Saskatchewan Premises Identification (PID) number.

Projects on land not owned by the applicant will require written authorization from the land owner.

Applicants must meet all regulatory requirements for water development projects. This may include:

- Saskatchewan Water Security Agency Groundwater and/or Surface Water Approval.
- Aquatic Habitat Protection Permit from Water Security Agency prior to commencing the project if the work will occur in or near water bodies.
- Canadian Environmental Assessment Act compliance.
- Approval from the rural municipality if a pipeline crosses road allowances.
- Any other standards or approvals as required by law.

A Water Rights Licence from the Water Security Agency is required for:

• Water development projects where annual usage exceeds 5,000 cubic metres.

· Pipeline projects where the point of diversion (water source) or point of use (water distribution) is not on land owned or controlled by the applicant.

# Eligible Items

### Well Decommissioning

Eligible activities include:

- · Excavation (removing casing).
- · Bentonite, chlorine.
- · Gravel or clay (must be third party purchase).
- Costs related to well decommissioning including sealing and capping waterwells by a registered well driller.

The following eligibility parameters also apply:

- Small diameter wells must be decommissioned by a registered well driller with expertise in well decommissioning and comply with Water Security Agency (WSA) recommended practices and comply with Water Security Agency (WSA) recommended practices.
- Large diameter or bored well decommissioning pre-approval worksheet must be completed and attached to FRWIP application.
- · A post-construction WSA Well Decommissioning worksheet must be completed and submitted with FRWIP claim and signed by the landowner.

### Special Projects

A special project is defined as a project to develop a secure and sustainable water supply that is not a typical dugout, pipeline or well project. The special projects stream is not an alternative for producer applicants whose standard water development projects exceed the rebate maximum. Applicants must submit a clear description and rationale for the project.

Examples of projects that may be considered are:

- · Rural water connections (multi-user pipelines where dugouts and wells are not feasible or of sufficient water quality):
  - A maximum program payment of \$15,000 per eligible applicant (multi-user pipeline subscription/connection fees) per approved project;

- Potable or non-potable water for agricultural use (livestock watering, value-added) processing, etc.) will be considered and approved on a case by case basis when justified; and
- · Community water development projects for agricultural use (i.e. small-diameter and large-diameter wells in conjunction with a community tank loading facility, dugouts in conjunction with a community tank loading facility, increasing storage capacity at an existing community tank loading facility to reduce tank loading times);
  - SaskPower service and associated electrical costs to a maximum rebate of \$20,000 per approved project.

# Ineligible Items

Ineligible items include:

- Water resources developed solely for household use or washing machinery.
- Projects commencing prior to October 1, 2017.
- Power service installation, hook-up, electrical wiring, generators, electrical panels, breakers, electrical connectors and other electrical devices or hardware.
- Taxes, financing fees, interest or legal fees.
- Materials from inventory.
- · Used material and infrastructure to be eligible new items and infrastructure must be purchased from a reputable dealer.
- Water meters, water storage tanks under 1000 US gallons/3700 litres and water storage tanks not connected to the project infrastructure.
- Gas/diesel powered water pumps.
- · Seismic testing/water witching.
- In-kind freight.
- · In-kind materials such as rocks, gravel or clay.
- · In-kind payment (e.g. trading) for third party services/supplies.
- · Water quality enhancement systems (e.g. aeration systems, filtration systems, chlorinators, reverse osmosis, etc.).
- Materials and construction costs for pump houses.
- · Removal and disposal of above ground structures.
- Purchase of land/property or payment of easements.
- · Replacement of existing water infrastructure such as water appliances, storage tanks or water troughs.
- Above ground pipelines and dams.

- · Landscaping or removal/hauling dugout spoil piles.
- · Hauling or pumping water to fill/empty dugouts.
- · Non-permanent fencing (e.g. corral panels, bale feeders, etc.).

# Deadlines

Well-decommissioning and special project (pre-approval) applications and claims are accepted on an ongoing basis. All applications must be submitted for approval on or before August 1, 2022.

Projects must have started on or after October 1, 2017 and completed 18 months following approval or by December 31, 2022.

# FARM AND RANCH WATER INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM (FRWIP) WELL DECOMMISSIONING & SPECIAL PROJECTS PRE-APPROVAL APPLICATION

DEADLINE: Applications for pre-approval projects must be received on or before AUGUST 31, 2022.

Claim forms MUST be received the earlier of 18 months from written project approval or before DECEMBER 31, 2022.

#### PROGRAM INFORMATION

#### **ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS:**

- Saskatchewan producers, farmers, ranchers, value-added agricultural businesses, Saskatchewan Rural Municipalities and Saskatchewan First Nation communities.
- 18 years of age and file income tax demonstrating a minimum of \$50,000 gross farm income or income derived from processing primary agricultural commodities in the year preceding or in the year of application in Saskatchewan.
- Have an agricultural or eligible value-added business use for the water.
- Producers who own, lease or rent property where livestock and poultry are grown, bred, kept, raised, displayed, assembled or disposed of require a Saskatchewan Premises Identification (PID) number.

#### **ELIGIBLE PRE-APPROVAL PROJECTS:**

- Well Decommissioning
  - For large diameter or bored wells, a Water Security Agency (WSA) Bored Well Decommissioning Pre-approval Worksheet is required.
  - Small diameter wells must be decommissioned by a registered well driller and comply with WSA recommended practices.
- Special Projects (a solution to a water issue that because of the complex nature and scope, cannot be addressed by a
  typical dugout, pipeline or well) must include a compelling business case to be considered for pre-approval. Examples
  include, but not limited to:
  - Community water development.
  - Development of or connecting to rural water utilities (special circumstances apply).

#### **FUNDING:**

- Costs related to well decommissioning (pre-approval project) are funded at 90% of eligible costs to a maximum program payment of \$10,000 per project.
- Costs related to special projects (pre-approval project) are funded at 50% of eligible costs, to a maximum program
  payment of \$150,000 over life of the program.
- Program payments are subject to a minimum rebate of \$250; minimum claim amount is \$500.

#### **ELIGIBLE COSTS:** See Component Guidelines

#### LIMITATIONS ON ELIGIBLE EXPENSE ITEMS:

- In-kind labour \$20/hr.
- In-kind machinery/equipment, utilize rates established in the Farm Machinery Custom Rate and Rental Guide for class of machinery used.
- Installation of power associated with a community water development project to a maximum program payment of \$20,000 per approved project.
- Subscription or hook-up fees to a multi-user pipeline to a maximum program payment of \$15,000 per approved project.
- Any other amount and maximum program payment as determined and approved by the Ministry.

#### **INELIGIBLE ITEMS INCLUDE:**

- · Seismic testing/water witching.
- · Water quality enhancement system.
- Taxes, financing fees, interest or payment of easements.
- Above ground pipelines.
- In-kind freight and in-kind payment (e.g. trading) for third party services/supplies.
- Any item in any amount as determined by the Ministry.

Submit your completed claim within 18 months of receiving project approval or before DECEMBER 31, 2022, whichever is earlier.

Bentonite requirements are based on 1 foot thick sections with 1 foot (fit) thick bentonite plugs to be placed at the bottom of the well and at the top of the perforated section. Wells deeper than 40 ft require additional plugs every 20 ft.
